Verse 1

- A. My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin.
 - Why does he call them "My little children?"
 - What is the purpose of this "fatherly" declaration? (see MacArthur's comments)
- B. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.
 - What is John acknowledging here?
 - What two things does this verse tell us about Christ and His work?
 - What is the function of an advocate (Greek: parakletos)?

Verse 2

- A. And He Himself is the propitiation for our sins,
 - What does the word propitiation mean?
- B. And not for ours only but also for the whole world.
 - Does this mean that the whole world will be saved? (see MacArthur's comments at the beginning of the next lesson [Keys to the Text])
 - If it doesn't, what does it mean?
 - What does the L in T.U.L.I.P stand for?

Application

- 1. Are we really called not to sin?!
- 2. If we do sin, how are we forgiven?
- 3. Why do we do mission work if God already has atoned for His elect?
